Ordinance for 2-years Diploma Programme Based on Yearly System

(Implemented from Academic Year 2003.2004)

1.0 TWO YEARS DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES

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Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University Raipur awards first Diploma in disciplines of Engineering/Technology based disciplines as approved by All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi, and Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), New Delhi of two years duration, hereinafter called 2- YDP. shall be designated as DIPLOMA IN respective Branch.

- 1.1 This diploma shall include the branch of PHARMACY.
- 1.2 The studies and examinations of the Diploma programme shall be on the basis of Yearly-System.

2.0 RULES FOR ADMISSIONS

2.1 The minimum qualification for admission to the first year of the PHARMACY Diploma programmes (Admission BASED ON INSTITUTION WISE MERIT):-

Shall be the passing of 12" class or higher examination under (10+2) education scheme with Science (Physics and Chemistry) and Biology/Mathematics as main subjects and obtaining 50 % marks in aggregate in aforesaid subjects conducted by C.G.. Board of Secondary Education or an equivalent examination from a recognized Board/University, SC/ST and OBC candidates are not required to obtain minimum 50% marks.

In general, admission to all diploma programme shall be governed by the rules framed by D.T.E. (C.G.) from time to time or any other competent authority of the state govt. of Chattisgarh/ Pt. R.S.U/PCI.

3. 0 RULES FOR PASS FOR TWO YEARS DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY IMPLEMENTED FROM 2003-04

Rules for pass, eligibility for appearing/award of sessional marks/award of division etc. from year 2003-04

These rules shall be applicable only to student who are admitted under E.R. 1991-amended up to as E.R. 1996 (Education Regulation 1996)

(December 1996)

There shall be two examinations, one to examine students for first year Diploma in Pharmacy (part I) and the other for students of second year Diploma in Pharmacy (Part II). Examination shall be both in Theory and Practicals as per scheme of examination in accordance to E.R. 1991 implemented w.e.f.1992-23 academic session and amended up to as E.R. 1996.

(a) Each examination shall be held twice in a year. First examination in a year shall be annual examination and the second examination as supplementary, examination shall be of written and practical (including oral) carrying maximum marks for each part of a subject indicated in Table-III and IV of E.R. 1996.

(b) A Candidate who has appeared in all the subjects in Theory and corresponding Practicals of First year or of the Second year but fails in some subjects shall be deemed to have been exempted from re-appearing in the subjects in which he has passed separately in Theory and corresponding Practical both.

- (c) A Candidate, who fails in Theory or Practical examination, shall reappear in such Theory or Practical paper(s) as the case may be.
- (II) (a) ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARING IN THE EXAMINATION FOR DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY PART-I.

Only such candidates who produce certificates from the Head of the Academic Institution, in which he/she has undergone the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I. courses in Proof of his/her having regularly and satisfactorily undergone the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I course, by attending not less than 75% of the classes held—

both in theory and practical separately in each subject, shall be eligible for appearing at the examination or Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I.

(II) (b) ELIGIBILTY FOR APPEARING IN THE EXAMINATION FOR DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY, PART-II.

Only such candidates who produce certificates from the Head of the Academic Institution, in which he/she has undergone the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II course in proof of his/her having regularly and satisfactorily undergone Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II course of study, by attending not less than 75% of the classes held both in theory and practicals separately, in each subject, shall be eligible for appearing at the Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-II examination).

(III) ELIGIBILITY FOR PROMOTION TO DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY, PART-II.

- (a) All candidates, who have appeared for all the subjects and passed the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I examination, are eligible for promotion to the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II class. However failure in more than two subjects shall debar him/her from promotion to Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II class.
- (b) A candidate is required to clear all the subjects of first year within a period of TWO YEARS (Including the academic session in which he/she was granted admission in first year for the first time). If he/she is unable to do so, his/her name will be removed from the roll list of the collage/institute i.e. he/she will have to discontinue his/her further study in polytechnics of Chattisgarh.
- (IV) ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARING IN DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY, PART-III

Shall be as per E.R. 1991 amended up to E.R. 1996.

Diploma in Pharmacy Part-III shall consist of a certificate. of having satisfactorily completed course of practical training as prescribed in chapter-III of E.R. 1996.

- (V) AWARD OF SESSIONAL MARKS AND MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS.
- (a) A regular record of. Both theory and practical class work and examination conducted in an institution imparting training for the course for Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-I) and Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II shall be maintained.
- (b) Twenty marks for each theory subject and twenty marks for each practical shall be allotted for sessional examination.

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There shall be at least three periodic sessional examinations, during each academic year. Average of any two best performances; shall form the basis for calculating final sessional marks in individual Theory/Practical.

Sessional marks for practicals shall be

- Actual performance in the sessional examination: 10 marks. (a)
- Day to day practical class work assessment: 10 marks. (b)
- Record for Day to Day class work assessment of the candidate shall be kept maintained for one more additional academic year, after the completion of main examination of that part.

MINIMUM MARKS FOR PASSING THE EXAMINATION:-(VI)

A student shall not be declared to have passed Diploma in Pharmacy examination, unless he/she secures at least 40% marks in each of the subject separately in the theory examination including sessional marks and at least 40% marks in each of the practical examination including sessional marks.

AWARD OF DIVISION:-(VII)

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The division will be awarded as per following scheme.

- 75% marks or above in aggregate in a single attempt': First (a) Division (Hons.)
- 60% marks or above in aggregate in a single attempt: First (b) Division.
- 50% marks or above in aggregate in a single attempt : Second (c) Division.
- :'Pass Division Less than 50% Marks in aggregate
- A candidate who passes an examination in second or subsequent (d)attempts shall be declared to have passed in Pass Division, irrespective of any percentage of marks secured by him. (e)
- A candidate securing 75% marks or above in any subject or subjects shall be declared to have passed with distinction in that subject or those subjects, provided he/she passess in all the (f)subjects in a single attempt. Contd. &

A candidate who could not appear in full main examination, due to illness of self or due to genuine reason may be allowed to appear in supplementary examination, which will be treated as his first attempt, provided he submit medical certificate to the university through the principal of the concerned institutional from an authorized medical officer not below the rank of asst. surgeon, for his/her illness or submits a suitable explanation for his genuine reason to the full satisfaction of the principal, within 30 days, from the date of commencement of examination.

(VIII) RULES FOR GRACE MARKS.

No grace marks shall be awarded to the candidate as per PCI instructions.

(IX) IMPROVEMENT OF SESSIONAL MARKS: -

Facility of sessional improvement is only available to student declared FAIL Student who have PASSD are not entitled for sessional improvement in the ensuring session. (As per PCI letter No. 14-24/86-PCI/4273 dated 31/8/95)

- (a) Student who have secured 40% of marks allotted for sessional in a subject (theory or practical) shall not be eligible for sessional marks improvement in the same subject (theory or practical)
- (b) A candidate who wishes to improve sessional marks can do so by appearing in two additional sessional examinations during the next academic year. Average score of these two examinations shall be, basis for improved sessional marks in theory.
- (c) The sessional of practical shall be improved by appearing in two additional practical examinations in next academic year. Average score of these two examination shall be, basis for improved sessional marks in practicals
- (d) There shall be no sessional improvement in. any day-to-day assessment in practical of the subject unless he takes regular admission.
- (e) Provided further that request to improve the sessional shall be entertained only once that too in next academic year but not in subsequent year.

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(f) After appearing for sessional improvement test, student will have to appear in theory paper as well, of the said subject. in subsequent main/supplementary examination. since theory marks (of the subject) obtained in earlier examination will not be carried forward. after appearing for improvement test.

(X) RULES FOR MAXIMUM DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME

The maximum duration for passing all the courses (Theory and Practical) of the programme shall be FOUR YEARS for two years diploma programmes, no separate time will be given to students for medical or any reason what-so ever.

(XI) AWARD OF CERTIFICATE OF DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY

A Certificate of Diploma in Pharmacy shall be granted to n successful candidate on producing certificate of having passed the Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I and Part-II, and satisfactory completion of practical training for Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-III).
