ORDINANCE No. 75

MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION EXAMINATION (Two Years Course)

- 1. The examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education shall consist of two parts:-
 - (a) The Previous Examination and
 - (b) The Final Examination.

Eligibility

- 2. A candidate who, after obtaining the degree of Bachelor of Physical Education of the University or an examination of any statuary University in India which has been recognised by the University as equivalent to Bachelor of Physical Education's degree of the University and has completed a regular course of study for one academic year in a teaching department of the University or in a college affiliated to the University, shall be admitted to the previous examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education. Provided that he/she shall have passed the Examination for Bachelor of Physical Education degree securing minimum 45% of marks in theory.
- 3. A candidate who, after passing the Master of Physical Education Previous Examination of the University, has completed a regular course of study for one Academic year in a teaching department of the University or in a College affiliated to the University, shall be admitted to the Final Examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education.

A candidate, who has passed the Previous Examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education of another University, may also be admitted to the Final Examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education, after obtaining previous permission of the Kulpati on the recommendation of the Chairman of Board of Studies that he/she has offered for his Previous Examination a course of study of an equivalent standard with almost identical syllabus as is required for the Previous Examination of this University, and has attended a regular Course of study for one Academic year in a Teaching Department of the University or in a College affiliated to the University.

- 4. The Examination shall consist of theory, practical and sessional as per requirment of syllabus.
- 5. Ex-student shall be eligible for admission to the examination as per provision of Ordinance No. 6.
- 6. In Order to pass at any of the Previous or Final Examinations, a candidate must obtain at least 40% marks in each written paper and practicals and 50% in each Sessional work. However to pass the candidate must secure in the Examination 48% marks in aggregate.
- 7. The Division of the candidate shall be determined on the basis of total marks obtained in the Previous and Final Examination.
- 8. Candidate securing 60% or above marks shall be palced in First Division and candidate securing less that 60% marks shall be placed in the Second Division.
- A unsuccessful Candidate appearing as Ex-student shall be allowed to carryover the sessional marks obtained for the next examination.
 In the event of candidate seeking admission as regular candidate shall not be entittled to carry over the sessional marks.
- 10. A successful candidate in the Final Examination will be allowed to carry over the marks obtained in dissertation, appearing subsequently as an ex-student provided the Candidate has been successful in dissertation.
 - The Candidate shall submit three copies of the dissertation two weeks before the commencement of the examination, failing to which the student shall not be allowed to appear in the Examination. However the candidate may submit the said dissertation for the subsequent year.
- 11. The scheme of Examination and the Courses of Studies shall be as provided in the syllabus.

12. The Tution, Examination and other fees shall be as follows:-

(1) Yearly Tution Fee - Rs. 400/-

(2) Examination Fee - Rs. 75/-

(3) Dissertation Fes, if opted for - Rs. 50/-

(4) Yearly Gymnasium Fee - Rs. 100/-

(5) Other fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.
