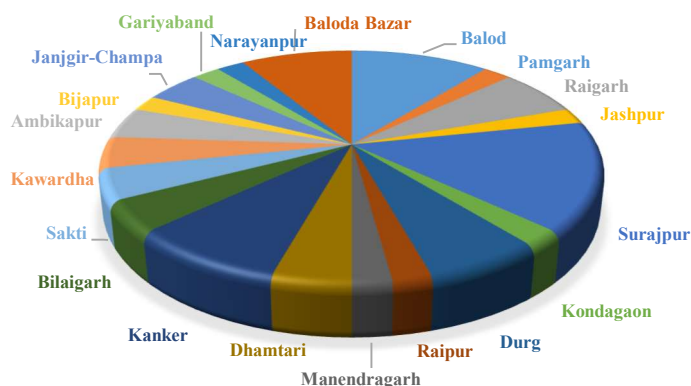
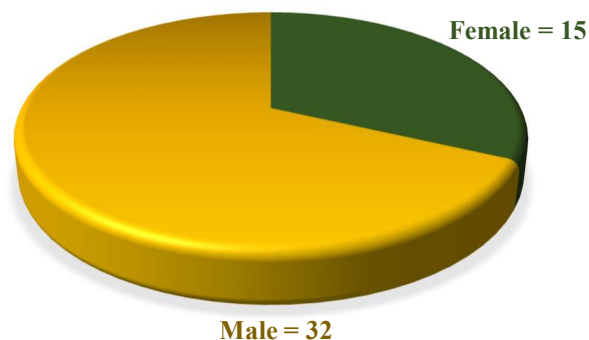

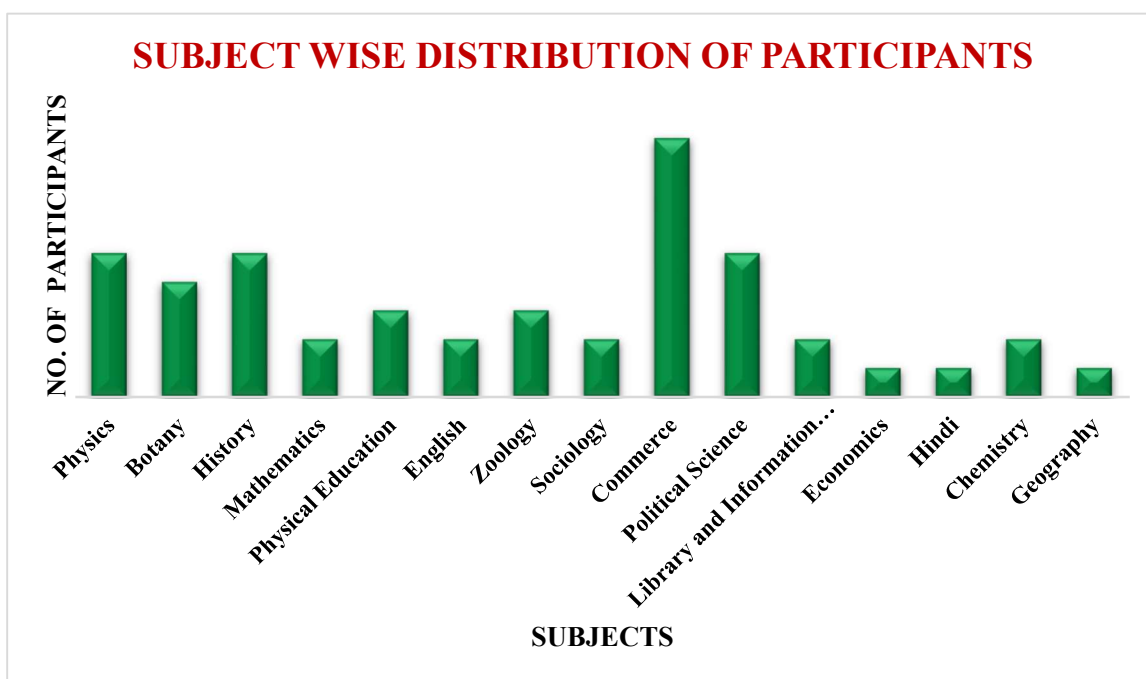
Faculty Induction Program – (GURU-DAKSHATA)

(08.01.2024 – 09.02.2024)

Faculty Induction Program (GURU-DAKSHTA) of one month from 08.01.2024 to 09.02.2024 was conducted under the ambitious plan of Pt. Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Education. The main objective of this program was to provide information related to technical and educational aspects of higher education to newly appointed assistant professors in colleges and universities. Forty-four assistant professors from various regions of Chhattisgarh participated in this program. Out of which 09 from Commerce, 05-05 each from Physics, History and Political Science, 04 from Botany, 03-03 each from Zoology and Physical Education, 02-02 each from Mathematics, Chemistry, Sociology, English and Library and Information sciences and 01-01 from Economics, Hindi, Geography. Among them, 32 participants were male and 15 participants were female. All the ten modules of the program had been carefully designed to incorporate the four coordinates (e-tutorials, e-content, web resources and self- assessment) prescribed by UGC. Eminent educationists and experts of various subjects (List enclosed) made the participants aware of the values of the society, new education system, research and new techniques through very good, effective and inspiring lectures and their doubts were resolved. Objective type online test of 10 marks at the end of each module as well as e-content development, brainstorming, Assignment, Seminar, Microteaching etc. from each module were conducted by the organizers and were successfully attended by the participants. 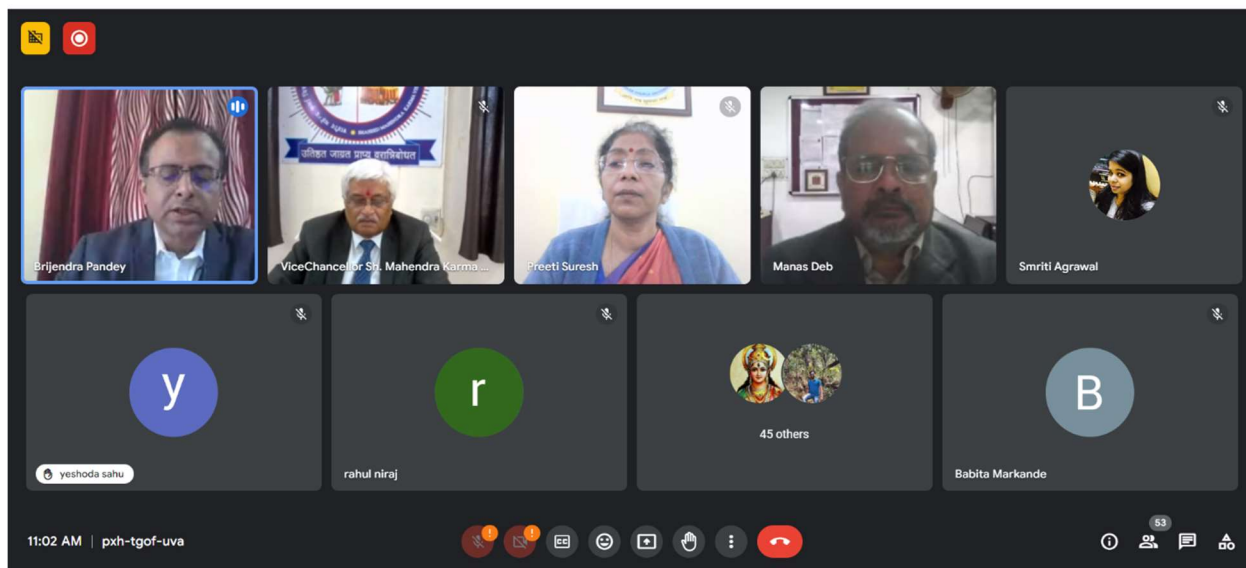
Online Faculty Induction program (Guru-Dakshata) was organized from 08/01/2024 to 09/02/2024. Various programmes were conducted date wise.

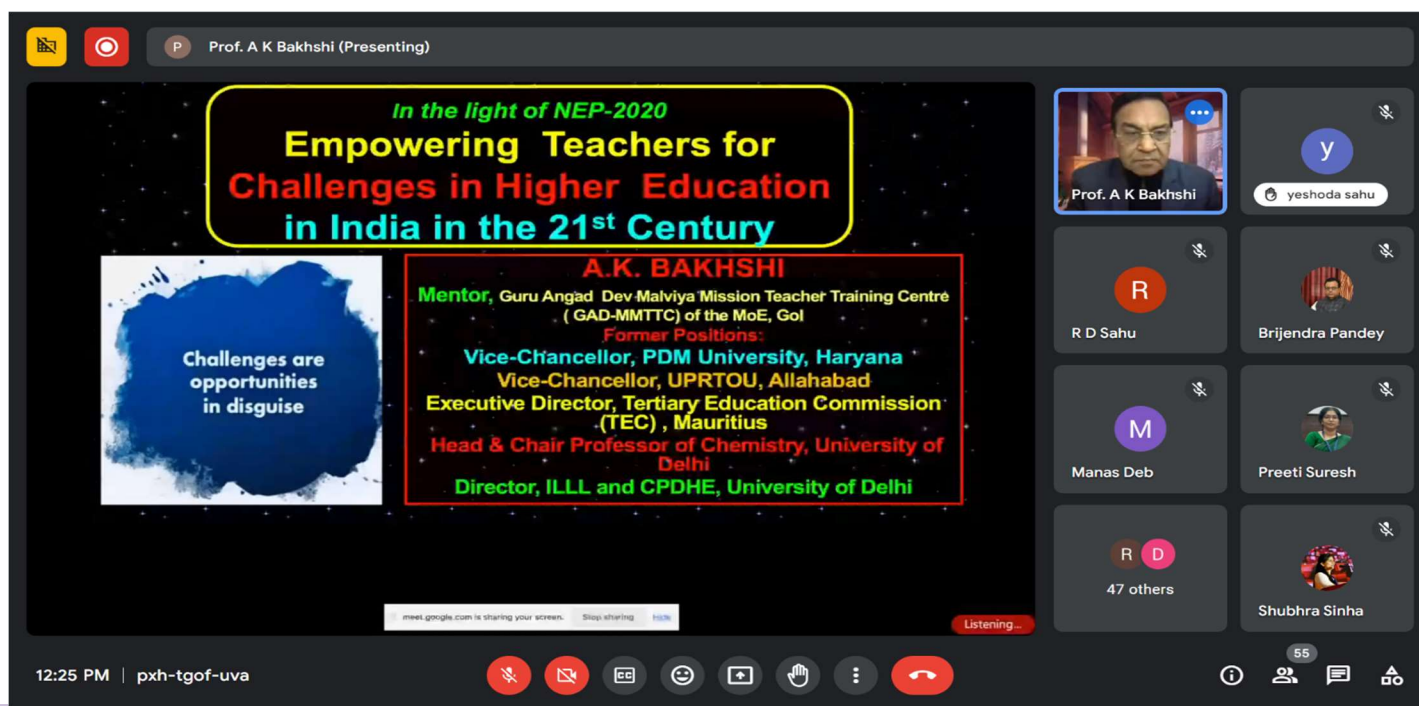


Session II (12:15 to 13:45)

DAY 3, 10-01-2024

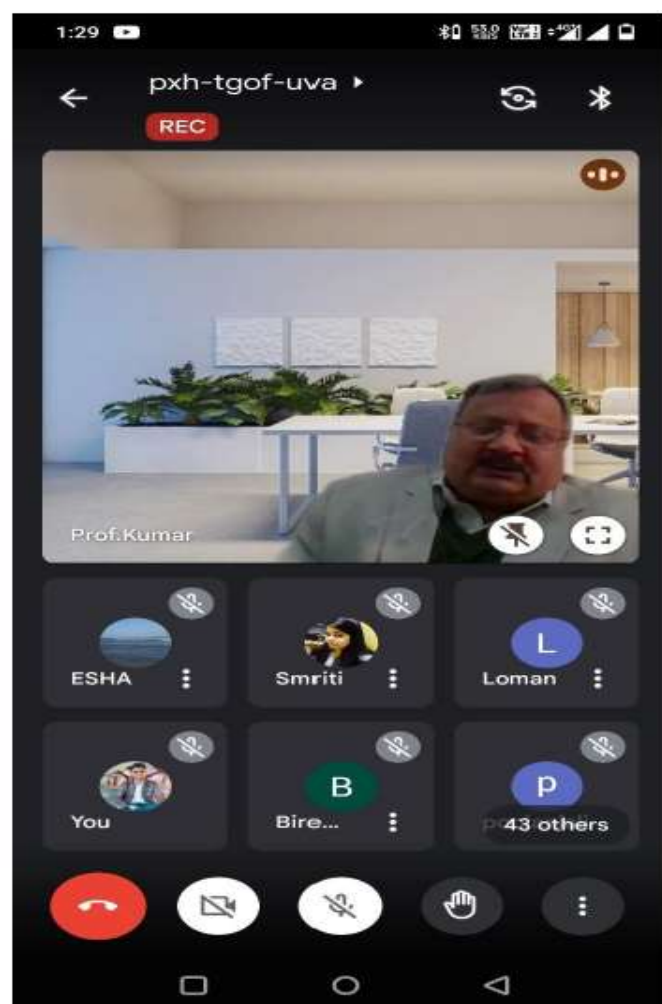
Session I (10:30 to 12:00) & Session II (12:15 to 13:45)
