- Interoperable criminal justice system (ICJS):
  - Interoperable criminal justice system (ICJS) being one of the most useful real time digital platform for criminal network visualization. Real time online entries of cases received for examination and generating online receipt is being done under my supervision and after examination of the cases, information regarding report is sent through ICJS to concerning Superintendent of Police. Simultaneously reports are being uploaded on ICJS plate form facilitating each pillar of criminal justice system to see the reports immediately.
- With great efforts got Govt. permission for opening the Narco-test and Polygraph Test. Related training is also done by one Joint Director and one Senior Scientific Officer at Bangaluru and Mumbai lab. Working procedure manual has been prepared for polygraph

test. MOU with AIIMS Raipur for conducting Narco-test is under process. Both of these tests will start very soon in SFSL Raipur.

Cyber Crime branch is going to established soon.

One more Regional Forensic Science Laboratory is being established in Durg.

Pendency is reduced to maximum of one month in all sections of forensic science laboratory being a big support to quick disposal of criminal justice system.

- Promotions and rewards :
- Three IPS officers were promoted as Inspector General of Police, One as Deputy Inspector General of Police & One as Additional General Director of Police.
- 3 SPS officers were inducted into the IPS cadre on promotion.

  personnel were transferred and posted based on grievance redressed and administrative
  exigencies. Newly appointed 485 Sls & 39 Subedars were posted to Districts for practical
  training. Cadre allocation matters were followed up, and units were instructed to relieve
  10 personnel on final allocation to Madhya Pradesh.
- Acted as a repository of the Annual confidential Reports of all Gazetted (non-IPS) and Non-Gazetted officers of Chhattisgarh Police, including the Ministerial staff. Maintained Annual confidential Report folders of Non-Gazetted officers of 4700 and 384 Gazetted officers, total - 5084 officers.
- Review and analysis of periodical inspection notes and audit reports received from the various units of the organization were made and necessary guidelines and instructions were issued to facilitate better policing and resource management.
- As a nodal branch of police headquarters, effectively co-ordinate with the State Government, Ministry of Home Affairs of Central Government on various administrative and police matters. Ensured timely disposal of all references received from the Government and other agencies.   conducted, and Audit reports were carefully studied. Thereafter necessary action
  wherever needed was taken up with the approval of the Director-General of police.
- As the Nodal officer, all the important cases with time limit and cases pertaining to the police Department have been disposed of in coordination with the Home (police) Department every month.
- Performed as overall charge of security, law and order, and arrangements for Honorable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on his visit to Dantewada, Bastar Range on 9th May 2015. Could organize and deliver effectively all the aspects as expected to the best, in such highly Maoist-affected region. The work was appreciated by DGP, chief secretary, and the Government.
- During the review period, was also given additional responsibility of in-charge of Rail/Traffic (18-02-16 to 27-02-16 and 07-04-16 to 14-04-16, (26-12-15 to 08-01-16 and 22-02-16 to 01-03-16) and rail-communication (18-09-15 to 28-01-2016), contributed best with extra efforts as required.
- Nominated as chairman for the disposal of court cases of Honorable High court, Bilaspur related to pay inconsistency of Ministerial Staff of the police Department & Samuhik Beema Vikalpa Visheh Anudaan yojna, 2008.
- Nominated as Dy. chairman of the committee for Chhattisgarh Police paropkar Nidhi, Chhattisgarh Police Amenity Fund, and Chhattisgarh police Shiksha Nidhi.
- Nominated as Member of committees for Chhattisgarh Police Sankat Nidhi, central Mess committee, Chhattisgarh police-public school. Appointment of SPS officers on Higher Grade Pay scale, Time scales to SPS officer, out of turn promotion, and the committee constituted for the recommendation of Indian Police Medal for Meritorious services and President's Police Medal for Distinguished services. Timely meetings were conducted, and cases disposed after due deliberations.
- Towards the welfare measures Rs.1,22,30,000/- from "Paropkar Nidhi", Rs.3,37,05,741/- from "Sewa Samman Nidhi", Rs.34 lakh from "Shahid Samman Nidhi", Rs.19,60,000/- from 'rain basera Nidhi", Rs.1,81,44,500/- from Welfare Fund, Rs.12,13,900/\_ from Amenity Fund, Rs.1,73,000/- from central Loan Fund, Rs.86,93,800/- from "Shiksha Nidhi", and Rs.9 lakhs from Mess Nidhi have been disbursed to the various units of Chhattisgarh police, to carryout welfare activities smoothly.
