1. Assessment and Awareness of Antenatal Health Care Services Among Rural Woman of Chhattisgarh

Identification of the Issues

Before taking up any research it is very important to identify the issues, if any, that needs to be addressed.'CBPR' is an increasingly popular term, particularly in the field of health research. While some definitions of CBPR have a focus on health, we are using the term in a broader sense to encompass research in a variety of fields that is 'community-based' and 'participatory'. CBPR is research that entails some degree of active involvement of a range of community stakeholders and generally operates from a value base, derived from a commitment to sharing power and resources and working for beneficial outcomes for all participants.

Indeed, Israel, Schultz, Parker, and Becker (1998), in an influential review, characterize CBPR as research that is based on a set of values that includes the promotion of equal partnerships and co-learning and an explicit commitment to ensuring research leads to, and is informed by, action.

This description of CBPR could fit equally well with much research that is characterized as 'participatory action research' (PAR).

Identification of the issue in the community

For the identification of issues that were required to be addressed we visited the adjoining villages of Raipur. In the first visit to the village, we approached the village head, who is locally called "Sarpanch". He introduced us to community health workers of that area. We also met two teachers of primary school on our first visit. Our aim was rapport establishment and identification of the issues, if any, which was required to be addressed. In our second visit to the village, a door to door medicine distribution for Filarial was going on, in which we joined hands with

the health workers .Went door to door with them. In this run we met a couple of families and had some discussions of their general well being. Around the conversation, we came to know that there existed some issues regarding the Antenatal health care services and the community members wanted those issues to be addressed. This is how we focused our study around the ANC health care services and utilization of various health schemes for pregnant and lactating woman as well as for children below six years of age .Utilization of the various health schemes run under health care centers i.e. under the Anganwadi centers were covered in this study.

Health is a common theme in most of the cultures & communities have their own believe systems as well as concepts of health as a part of their culture. The broader aim was *HEALTH FOR ALL*.

The issues that we worked on were as under-

- Utilization of Antenatal Health Care Services run under anganwadi centers.
- Assessment of various ongoing Government schemes for ANC health Care services.

Area of Study

Area of study was the adjoining villages of Raipur situated at Amleshwar, which covered six health care centres which are called "Anganwadi centres".

- · Pregnant and lactating mothers.
- Children below 6 years age group.

Assessment & Utilization of Government Antenatal Health Care Services

- Janani Suraksha Yojna
- Prime Ministers MatriVandanYojna
- ANC care at Community Health Centres.
- Mahatari express Yojna
- Immunization of the new borns
- Nutritional Food Supply Scheme(PoshakAaharYojna) for Pregnant and Lactating Women and children under age group 6 years.

Key Findings

- Awareness for the various ANC services was very good.
- Acceptance for the ANC services was also excellent.
- Consumption of IFA tablets by the pregnant women was not up to the mark (300 IFA tablets was not done).
- Issues with receiving money transfer as per Matri Vandan Yojanana.
- Non availability of Health Care specialist and equipment's especially at the local health care centers.
- The distance of the health care centers for checkups by Specialists was not approachable.
- Non availability of sonography facilities at the local health care centers was observed.
- The supplementary food provided to the pregnant and lactating women as per Various Government schemes had issues regarding acceptance as per local taste and requirements.

Suggestions

- While dissemination of results was done at the community health center and panchayat office in presence of the community representatives and organizational heads demand for making changes in the supplementary food.
- They suggested for incorporation of high protein diet especially eggs,
 fishes and mushrooms at the health centers.
- They also suggested for fast money transfer as per Matri Vandan yojna.
- The community members also demanded for making changes in the supplementary food as pre local taste.

Recommendations

- > Availability of Specialist and better health facilities should be provided at their localities.
- Awareness programmes regarding intake of supplementary health food and health care promotion programmes should be promoted at the local communities.
- Improvisation in supplementary food should be done as per local needs, taste and availability.

2. Sexual Harassment & its Awareness With special reference to Sports

Introduction

India has a big name in the world of sports since last 70 years. With the increasing facilities provided by our Government in this sector several sports organizations are contributing to promote young girls and boys to take up sports as their carrier. A boom of new sports persons have brought a big name to our country in the international level in various sports events. With this not only boys but good number of girls are coming up in this sector. When gender comes intro role several gender issues come up that needs to be looked on. Hence we visited several sports organizations and focused our study in sexual harassment in the sports.

We worked with the girls who were residents of training academy at the age of 14-21 years. Our partners were Oxfam, sports personnel and group leaders of girls.

Using a community based participatory research approach we explored sexual harassment at workplace and awareness of sexual harassment among sports girls. Girls of (SAI) sports authority of India Raipur, who belonged to different rural area and who were from different sports field.

Method

FDG (focus group discussion), role play and art methods was applied. With the help of photo acts, poster making and showing them photos/videos to know their views.

Issues

- Gender Discrimination
- Sexual Harassment
- Awareness related to sexual harassment

Findings

- ➤ Gender discrimination and harassment were prevalent in community and family level. This is a hidden factor of girls not coming into the sports.
- When they come to sports they could understand more clearly about all these things. This is a positive attitude that their awareness level has increased regarding what is good touch and bad touch, but still they were not very much aware about the rules and regulations, but they knew how to keep themselves safe.
- ➤ Girls who came out and participating in sports, They have shown improve awareness regarding all this things as compare to their past background. This can be taken as a ideal situation and can be promoted if girls will play sports, their awareness level will increase.
- Girls expressed no harassment issues at training center. The sports personnel were member of the Internal Complaints Committee. Awareness programs regarding sexual harassment were organized for girls and boys in their academy.
- We prepared a report and conduct a meeting to shared our report with our partners and also we shared our report to state planning commission.

Recommendations

- Community involvement in such issues should be encouraged.
- Special recommendation that boys should be educated on gender issue.
- Awareness program on gender issues should be mandatory.
- Awareness about the Act and policies to be conducted.

3. A Study of Role of Women in Panchayati Raj System, Gram Panchayat Gomchi, Vikaskhand, Dharseeva, District Raipur

Introduction

Panchayati Raj System has a great impact in the lives of women folk in India. It has given a new working dimension for the women folk. Although women in India have excelled in various fields like administration, education, aviation industry, sports, medicine etc. There are so many examples that highlight the contributions of women in those sectors which were male dominated areas.

With reservation for women in various sectors they have proved themselves to be equally successful in the sectors which were male dominant like working in petrol pumps, panchayati raj, education, train driving etc. and they have broken the cultural barriers existing in the society and have contributed for bringing about appositive. Females used to have cultural barriers in working in various sectors. Women folk especially residing around villages have less access to education as compared to urban area. Inspite of the cultural barriers women are coming up in the field of administration in village level such as Panchayati raj.

Selection of Study area

For the present study Gram Gomchi was selected which is under Dharseeva Vikas Khand of Raipur District. It is around 10 kms. from Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University and situated near Nandanvan. Gram Panchayat is divided into 11 wards. A total of 210 households live here with a total population of 1290 which includes 646 females and 644 males. Among them 327 women and 368 males exercise the voting rights. Gram Gomchi has 2 "Ananganwadi" Centers" (Health care centres) and 4 "Mitanin" and 12 Self help Groups.

Issues & Concern

- In village Gomchi the elected sarpanch was a women candidate. This was a
 prime example of women empowerment. But after a few visits to the village.
 It was observed that the female elected representative i.e. "The Women
 Sarpanch" played a dummy role and her husband, who was called"
 "Sarpanch Pati" in local language, was more influential in taking up the
 administrating roles and decisions run under garm panchayat.
- Alcoholism and gambling among all age groups was found to be a prime concern.
- School drop outs was found to be in a big number.

Methods employed

Nukkard natak, Rally, FDG, Story telling, Case study, Audio recordings, Writing slogans.

Conclusion

- > There was a lack of communication between Gram panchayat and the local people.
- Political matters were found to influence the matters regarding cleaniness of the village surroundings and cleanliness of drains.
- > Husband of Sarpanch was more influential than the representative Woman Sarpanch of Gram Dhurva.
- Lack of coordination of Panchayat officials was observed which in turn affected the administration and working of the Panchayat body.
- > People were found to be highly addicted by alcohol and gambling ("JuaKhelna").
- > Presence of individuals in local meetings such as "Gram Sabha" and "Aamsabha" was minimal.
- Children were also found to have addiction of Ganja etc and had a higher reluctance for not attending the schooling. Frequency of school dropouts was very high.

Recommendations

- > The training for Panchayati Raj should be provided not only to the office bearers but also to all the villagers.
- The female representative should carry on her responsibilities by herself.
 Her family members should have no role or influence in any kind of decision making.
- For creating awareness for Nashabandi and gambling ,Torch Rallies (Maashal Rallies) should be promoted more often under the doimain of Gram panchayat.
- There should be communication and dialogue exchange between Gram Panchyat Officials and the villagers as a priority to better understand the issues and ways to solve those issues.
- In order to restrict the children from getting addicted from various addictions Bal Panchayat should be formed which will work for social cause and reforms.
- Promotion for school level education should be done for bringing a decline in school dropouts.
- Police patrolling should be done in the sensitive areas, on a daily basis for putting a check on gambling and alcoholism and its bad consequences in terms of crime.
- Role of "Maliha Camando" for social issues such as alcoholism, gambling and women related issues etc should be promoted.
