

POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN REGIONAL PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

- (1) The course of post-graduate Diploma in Regional Planning and Development shall be of full-time one year duration.
- (2) It shall be under the self-financing scheme of the university which shall prescribe the course fee etc. from time to time.
- (3) A candidate who has obtained Bachelor's degree in any of the discipline shall be eligible for admission to the Post-graduate Diploma course.
Admission to this course shall be given on the basis of interview and/or written test.
- (4) The examination shall consists of ^{Three} ~~four~~ theory papers each carrying 100 marks and one Dissertation/Field report carrying 100 marks.
- (5) For each theory paper 20% marks shall be awarded on the basis of internal evaluation.
- (6) The Dissertation/Field Report shall be evaluated by internal and external examiner followed by a Viva-voce test. The scheme of the evaluation of the Dissertation/Field Report shall be as under:

Internal Examiner	-	40
External Examiner	-	40
Viva-voce Test	-	20

The performance of the candidate in the viva-voce test shall be evaluated jointly by Head, Internal and External.
- (7) The candidates have to pass in each theory paper separately. The minimum passing marks of the each theory paper shall be 40%.
- (8) The candidates securing 75% or more marks in the aggregate shall be declared to have pass with Honours; those securing 60% or more marks in aggregate shall be declared to have pass in the first class; those obtaining less than 60% but not less than 48% in the second class; and those obtaining less than 48% but not less than 40% in the third class.

(9) The unsuccessful candidates will be required to take readmission in the course for which they shall be charged full fee.

(10) Matters not provided in this ordinance shall be governed by the provisions of General Ordinances. Matters not provided even in the General Ordinances, shall be governed by the order passed by the Kulpati.
