ORDINANCE RELATING TO BACHELOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (FOUR YEAR DEGREE COURSE)

NAME OF COURSE

The duration of the course of instruction for the Degree of Bachelor of Physical Education shall be four years and the examination shall be held in four parts vis. Part-I at the end of first academic year, Part-II at the end of the second academic year, Part-III at the end of the third academic year and Pavt-IV (Final) at the end of fourth academic year.

- 2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE COURSE
 2.1 A candidate shall be eligible to appear in admission test to the BPE-I year if he/she has passed any one of the following examination with atleast 45-40% marks (40-35% for SC/ST candidates).
- a. Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2) of any recognised School Education Board.

OR

Certificate in Physical Education of atleast two years duration after metric.

OR

Any other examination recognised by the Academic Council of the Institute as equivalent to a & b above.

- b. If he/she has participated and represented his/her School/College in the Inter-school/Intercollegiate Competition or any other equivalent recognized competition.
- c. He/She has age below 21 years on 1st September of the year of admission (relaxable upto 25 years in case of National/International Sportsman or the members of SC/ST and OBC).
- 2.2 A student must obtain minimum 45 percent marks in aggregate total and also in separate areas on specified entrance test to be eligible for admission. If more candidates qualify then the candidates will be admitted purely on the basis-of merit.
- 2.3 Any candidate in employment (whole time, part time or honorary service) shall be allowed to join the course by taking leave from his/her employer, from the date of commencement of academic session to the conclusion of the examination.

3. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

- 3.1 Those who fulfill stipulated conditions in Clause 2.1 (a, b & c) of these rules shall be eligible to take admission test, Admission to BPE I year shall be made strictly on the basis of Merit in the admission test.
- A committee consisting of at least three faculty members shall be constituted to screen applications to ascertain eligibility of candidates. Only eligible candidate shall be allowed to take admission tests. Doubtful cases shall be referred to Vice Chancellor through Head of the Department whose decision shall be final.
- 3.3 An admission committee shall be constituted to Coordinate and finalise admissions. The final results will be prepared by the committee under their signatures. The list of selected candidates will be putup to Vice Chancellor for approval before declaring the result.
- 3.4 The H.O.D. (Teacher Education) shall be responsible for keeping record under safe custody pertaining to admissions for at least for one year and if no questions arise about admission records shall be transferred to general record section.

PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCTING TESTS

- 4. PHYSIAL FITNESS: obstacle Courses will be conducted to test the Physical Fitness. The Performance will be converted into points (Marks) as per the Norms give at Annexure---I. Explanation with diagram for conducting the test is also mentioned at the same Annexure-II.
- 4.1. GAMES PROFICIENCY: The candidates have to chose any one of the following games: Hockey, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Cricket, Judo, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Gymnastics, Swimming, Wrestling, Table-Tennis, Tennis, Handball and Yoga.

They will be tested in their chosen games by a committee of experts.

- 4.2 WRITTEN TEST: This is to test the basic English and/or Hindi writing ability and knowledge in Games & Sports.
 - (a) English/Hindi Writing ability (15 Marks)
 - (i) Translation from Hindi to English
 OR
 - (ii) Translation from English to Hindi
 OR
 - (iii) Essay Writing in English/Hindi
 - (b) Knowledge in Games & Sports (10 Marks)
 Question will be set both in English and
 Hindi Candidates may answer either in
 English or Hindi.

To qualify in this area a candidate should score 12 marks out of a maximum of 25 marks.

5. BONUS MARKS FOR GOOD ACHIEVEMENT:

- (a) ACHIEVEMENT IN GAMES & SPORTS: Marks to be awarded at a particular Level/Position are shown at Annexure---III.
- (b) ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT: One mark will be awarded for every 5% increase above 40% marks in the 10+2 or its equivalence. Detail Bonus Marks are shown at Annexure----IV.
- 5.1 The qualify a candicate must score the following marks:

Bonus marks for Achievement in Games & Sports will be given only in those Games & Sports in which Association of Indian Universities conducts tournament/Championships on regular basis at the Inter University Level.

- 5.3. **BLIGIBILITY FOR APPLYING**: Age and educational qualification have already been approved. Other required factors are:
 - (a) Should have represented his/her school in any Sports Competition.
 - - (i) 40% for General
 - (ii) 35% for SC/ST/OBC
- 5.4 MEDICAL TEST: The provisionally selected candidates shall undergo a thorough medical test to be conducted by the Institute and if he/she fails to pass the test, he/she will not be admitted.
- . 5.5 FINAL SELECTION: It will be made strictly according to the merit depending upon the available seats.
 - personally report and register their names (Payment of fees etc.) within 3 days from the declaration of Entrance Test Results. If they fail to do so, their names will be struck off from the list of the selected candidates and they will be replaced by the candidates who are in the waiting list.

6. EXAMINATION:

A candidate who has been admitted as per laid down clauses 2 and 3 of these rules.

- 6.1 Shall be eligible for appearing at the first examination for the BEP Degree, if he has completed regular course of study.
- Shall be eligible for taking Part-II examination of BPE-II after having passed Part-I examination in both activity and theory and having attended regular course of study for one academic year at the Institute.
- 6.3 Shall be eligible for appearing in Part-III examination for the BPE degree after passing Part-II of BPE examination in theory, and activity separately and having completed a regular course of study for one academic year at the Institute.

Shall be eligible for appearing in Part-IV examinations after passing Part-III of BPE examinations in theory, teaching practice, activity and having completed a regular course for one academic year at the Institute.

Provided further he should have attended Leadership Training Camp Organised by the Institute atleast 10 days.

- "Regular course of Study" means having attended atleast 85% lectures separately and each (theory subjects in each activity) and teaching practice and in each sports specialisation separately provided further that the following type of absence shall be treated as period spent on duty:
 - (i) Actual days of participation and travel in Intervarsity tournaments or any state or National level tournament for which prior approval of H.O.D. (Teacher Education) has been obtained.
 - (ii) Any responsibility given by the Institute for officiating, coaching or participation in other programme duly recognised by the Institute.

(OR)

Medical leave, personal leave of any kind shall not be treated as duty leave under any circumstances and will thus be treated as absence for the purpose of ascertaining eligibility to appear in final examination of any part.

- A candidate has to pass examination at the end of each year separately in Part-I, II and III (Theory, Practical Skill, Teaching Ability and Pard D as Specialisation). The result of examination shall be given separately in marksheets for each year under separate heads in theory, practical skills, teaching ability and specialisation. However in the degree, division shall be mentioned on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in all the parts. Degree shall have a separate mention regarding the participation of the student passed in BPE Final year.
- A candidate must pass in theory (Part A) subjects in each of the Part I, II and III examination securing atleast 33% marks and 33% marks in aggregate of final examination and sessional in each paper separately. In Part B Practical skill, Part C Teaching Ability and Part D Specialisation with a 40% marks and also 40% aggregate including sessionals.
- 6.8 A candidate must complete the degree of BPE and pass the final examination within a total period of eight years from his first admission to BPE-I course.

DIVISION :-

The division shall be assigned to the successful candidates on the following basls:-

-> III Division 33% and above, but below 45% of the aggregate marks.
-> II Division 45% and above, but below 60% of the aggregate marks.

- *-> I Division 60% and above, but below 75% of the aggregate marks,
- Distinction 75% and above.
- 7.2 "All examinee/student who fails by a total of not more than three marks in maximum two subjects in any of the BPE, but secures more than minimum aggregate marks (required), shall be given three grace marks by the Vice Chancellor to enable him to pass the examination."

The Vice Chancellor may award one grace mark in case the candidate fails by one mark or misses a higher division by one mark in BPE. The grace mark shall not, however, be added in the aggregate.

Provided a student will get the above benefit only once i.e. either to pass the examination or to secure a higher division.

8. SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION :-

- 8.1 A candidate failing in one theory paper of BPE-I, II, III and IV examination shall be eligible to appear in supplementary examination in the paper in which he/she has failed, to be conducted in the month of September and shall appear only in that paper. Such candidates shall be eligible to be admitted in the next higher class, if he/she fail in the supplementary examination he/she may take another supplementary examination alongwith the annual examination of the next higher class, if he/she, however, fails in the second supplementary also his/her result of the higher class will be cancelled and he/she shall have to appear a fresh in all the papers in the respective lower examination in the subsequent examination and shall be allowed to appear in the higher examination only when passed lower examination in full.
 - 8.2 A candidate, who fails in more than two theory subjects or in aggregate of activity/teaching practice/sports specialisation shall be declared failed and shall not be eligible to join the next higher class or the same class in that academic year. He must appear in the exam as an ex-student along with other regular students.
 - A student failing in any one of the parts shall be allowed to appear as ex-student in the annual examination in the respective parts only in which he has failed and his sessional marks, if any, previously obtained shall be carried over. A student who fails in sessional in any of the parts shall be declared failed and shall make up sessional in the part in which he has failed in the subsequent year as to be notified by the institute. He will not be eligible to take admission in higher class till he makes up his sessionals.

- At the end of BPE final exam each successful candidate shall receive a detailed marksheet in 8.4 addition to his Degree.
- DATE FOR EXAMINATION :-9.

The final examination at the end of each academic year shall be held in the month of April and Supplementary examination in the month of September on dates as approved by the Vice Chancellor provided owing to exigency of circumstance Vice Chancellor may postpone the examination as deemed fit.

DATE FOR EXAMINATION FEE :-10.

The last dates by which examination fee must reach the Registrar shall be as follows and no concession in this shall be made by any authority of the Institute.

MEDIUM OF EXAMINATION : 11.

Medium of Examination shall be English or Hindi.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION :-12.

The Scheme of examination and courses of studies shall be as decided by Board of Studies/committee from time to time.
